

THINGS TO KNOW OR THINK ABOUT

Ever doing a pattern stitch and have big problem with a row and do it over and over? You either have too many stitches left or not enough? Carefully you repeat K4, P2. YO K2tog and finally you successfully end the pattern and the knitting at the same time. You sit there so PROUD of your self ...you can count to 4!!!

Remember when it comes to knitting you are the BOSS. If the pattern doesn't work out you can make it right. Look at the knitting, rip it back, find your mistake do it over and over and over. If that doesn't work take it outside and run it over with your car until you feel better! You can't let the knitting forget who's boss!

Seriously here are three questions to ask yourself when having a problem

- 1 Have you considered that the pattern might be wrong and not you?
- 2 Is it possible you are interpreting the pattern incorrectly?
- 3 Would you be happier burying the thing under a tree and walking away

OK no more humor...

Did you know when felting darker colors felt more quickly than lighter colors? When working a multicolor stripe, work lighter colors on a smaller neelde. All will even out in the felting process.

There are many types of knitting needles. Does it matter which you choose for a project? Sometimes...For slippery yarns a bamboo or wooden needles keeps things from slipping off easily. For unforgiving cotton chenille smooth metal needles work best.

"Do I have enough yarn to finsh this row" we ask. To advoid frustration try this...If you have a length of yarn 3 times the width of your knit row you have enough to get across. If not, cut your losses and attach anew ball at the edge before you start across.

When binding off at the begining of armholes and necklines, don't knit or purl the first stitch. Instead, slip it and then work the second stitch and bind off as usual. Your curved edges will be smoother.

And about slipping stitches. You always slip a stitch as to purl unless the directions or technique (SSK for example) instruct you to slip as to knit.

Patterns often tell us to cast on *loosely*. These edges are often hat brims, sleeve cuffs or sweater bottoms...places that would be uncomfortable if too tight.. Cast on with a needle 1 size larger and then switch to appropriate needle.

WAVES SCARF

Materials 200 yds self striping yarn. Size #10 knitting needles

Technique DPS (works over 5 stitches) *K1, Yo, K1, YO twice, K1, YO three times, K1, YO twice, KI YO.

CAST ON 26 sts.

Row 1 Knit

Row 2 Knit

Row 3 DSP, K5, DSP, K5, DSP, K1

With lodging September 8 2009
No lodging September 15, 2009


Row 4 Knit dropping all YO's

Row 5 Knit

Row 6 Knit

Row 7 K5. DSP. K 5, DSP. K6

Row 8 Knit dropping all YO's Repeat Rows 1-8 until you are out of yarn. End on Row 2 or 6 BIND OFF.
